Event concept

The second and third day will be dedicated to transferable skills with interactive sessions given by the University of Durham in "Developing Entrepreneurial Behaviours" and "Planning your career".

DAY 3 - Tuesday 18 September 2018

Overall focus: Developing Entrepreneurial Behaviours

With an overarching theme of 'The Academic Entrepreneur' activities for the day will be designed to build and develop knowledge and awareness of the importance of the value of an enterprising mindset and behaviours within an academic context - whilst also drawing parallels to entrepreneurial activity and how entrepreneurship can fit into an academic setting.

Morning Session: 9.30 – 12.30

This session will explore how an enterprising mindset is highly valued in the academic environment as well as within the public, private and not for profit employment sectors. Activities will demonstrate how the research environment can offer a great deal of opportunity for people who have an enterprising mindset, by showing how it enables a culture of creativity and innovation, risk taking and opportunity identification - which underpins employability, enables entrepreneurship and facilitates knowledge transfer. The morning will provide an insight into what the enterprising mindset is, how it can be developed and practiced, and will also highlight how participants can recognise their own enterprising potential and move forward with new ideas.

Afternoon Session: 1.30 - 4.30

The afternoon will focus on drawing parallels between academia and entrepreneurship ('The Academic Entrepreneur'), and how to recognise the importance of both creating and articulating research impact. A final session will look at how to be enterprising in the academic environment in terms of adopting enterprising behaviours, and how an enterprising individual can contribute to organisation innovation and growth within a commercial as well as academic environment.

Practical information:

Drinks on the Sunday will be taking place at the Oriental Museum located at Elvet Hill Rd, Durham, DH1 3TH.

For those arriving via air to Newcastle airport, a taxi ride will take approximately 30 minutes and should cost ~£40,00.

If you want to choose to use public transport, a metro runs to and from the airport to Newcastle Central station and from there you will need to take a train to Durham Station. Note: buses do not run after 11pm and no trains will depart Durham station (or to Newcastle) after 12am.
